1. I went to the Warhawk Pantry committee meeting on Tuesday morning and here are some of the key points that we talked about:
 - a. They have more food coming in than going out, so they are looking for ways to reach more students. Currently, they are looking at how to get new clients. They do not want to have the stigma of a food pantry, but also, they do not want to put up a sign that says "free food."
 - b. They had a post on social media go viral and it gained them a larger following. They are going to take a look at what they can do on Instagram.
 - c. For their Covid response, the Warhawk Pantry has a Clem Delivery Program. When Clem has low occupancy, they want to be able to scale this program to off campus students that may be in need of it.
 - d. They are looking at different marketing options in Drumlin.
 - e. They want to create a Thanksgiving Bag. It would be a little something for those who need it for the holidays and do not want to go home to possibly expose their family
 - f. They discussed stopping the relationship with Feeding America, and instead, focusing on local community spaces.
 - g. In addition, they discussed working with a disposable service-ware that is microwavable for Clem students.
- iii. UC Board
1. They discussed two main things:
 - a. Should the UC be closed after finals for two weeks for cleaning?
 - b. Should there be UC Dining open after November 20?
 - i. There is a huge push for dining to stay open.
 - ii. Esker and Drumlin will be closed over the holidays.
